 - Healthy School Meals for All

Why focus on WIC?

- When women are pregnant, they need vitamins and minerals more than ever.
- Good nutrition during pregnancy and in the first years of a child's life is very important.
- Research shows that women who use WIC have healthier births and children who use WIC do better in school.

WIC: Basics and Updates

WIC provides pregnant women, new and breastfeeding moms, and children under 5 with:

- Breastfeeding support
- Nutrition counseling
- Referrals to health care and other services
- Nutritious foods

During/Since COVID-19:

- Remote services
- 3-4x boosted fruit/vegetable cash value benefits

Plus: **eWIC**, **WIC2GO** & <u>NEW 24/7 virtual assistant (Wanda)</u> make it easier than ever to enroll and shop with WIC

Still, WIC is reaching ~50% of eligible New Yorkers.

Many families are eligible for WIC but not participating.






WIC Public Health Services

WIC provides pregnant women, new and breastfeeding moms, and children under the age of 5 with:

- Breastfeeding support
- Nutrition counseling
- Referrals to health care and other services

It's true! You can get WIC benefits at home!

Who is eligible for WIC?

Someone **may** be eligible for WIC if they are:

- Pregnant
- A mom of a baby that is up to 6 months old
- A mom of a breastfeeding baby up to 12 months old
- A child under the age of five







Who is eligible for WIC?

To get WIC the participant **must**:

- ✓ Live in New York State
- ✓ Have an income below a certain amount or get benefits from SNAP, Medicaid or TANF
- ✓ Meet age and other eligibility rules

Note: An unborn child can be counted as a member of the household.

eWIC is here!

- Paper WIC checks are a thing of the past. The eWIC card acts just like a debit card.
- Families can buy food when it works best for them.
- Participants must use all of their benefits by the end of their thirty day cycle.

Wanda

- <u>Wanda</u>: NYS WIC's 24/7 virtual assistant chats in English and (new!) Spanish.
- <3minutes: Learn about WIC services, find out if a family is eligible, and get referrals to closest WIC clinics.
- Easy to use on a computer, tablet or phone.
- <u>Wanda resources</u> include graphics and sample language for use on your website, newsletters, emails and social media posts.

WIC helps families.

WIC supports moms, moms-to-be, and their families with:

- healthy food
- nutrition advice
- breastfeeding support
- referrals to other services



You may be eligible for WIC.

- You may be eligible if you: · live in New York
- · are pregnant or have a child under
- age 5
- meet income guidelines

Dads, grandparents, and other caregivers can apply for children under 5 in their care. Working families and non-U.S. citizens can qualify, too.

\$26-\$52/Month for Fruits & Veggies!

SNAP

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program:

- Our nation's primary anti-hunger program, providing monthly benefits to purchase food for all who meet program guidelines.
- For every 1 meal a Feeding America food bank provides, SNAP provides 9 meals.¹
- Every \$1 in SNAP benefits generates \$1.50 in economic growth.²
- SNAP participation **automatically qualifies** infants and toddlers for **WIC** and school-age children for **free school meals**.

SNAP in New York State

• Over 2.8 million New Yorkers use SNAP each month

34% of SNAP recipients are children

26 % of SNAP recipients are ages 60+

40% of SNAP recipients are adults age 18-59

13% of SNAP recipients live with a disability

SNAP also provides nutritional support for:

- Unemployed individuals
- Part-time or low-wage workers
- Those living on a fixed income

Online Application:

- New York City: <u>access.nyc.gov</u>
- Rest of State: <u>mybenefits.ny.gov</u>

Paper Application: LDSS-4826

- at SNAP office
- print from OTDA website
- request one be mailed
- alternative format applications



Documentation

Required to determine **eligibility**:

- Identity
- Age
- Household size
- Income
- Marital status

Required to determine **budget**:

- Shelter and utility costs
- Childcare and child support costs
- Out of pocket medical expenses*



Using SNAP benefits

- Monthly SNAP benefits are loaded onto an EBT card
- Use to purchase food, plants and seeds that grow food, honey and herbs
- Redeem benefits at grocery stores and markets, farmers markets, and some online retailers.





Maximizing SNAP and WIC

- Inform SNAP and WIC participants to use their WIC benefits
 <u>first</u> to avoid losing any value at the end of the month
 - WIC benefits expire
 - SNAP benefits roll over to the next month



Nutrition Outreach & Education Program (NOEP)

- NOEP offers **free and confidential** services to connect eligible New Yorkers with SNAP.
- Statewide, **87 local NOEP Coordinators** provide services in their county/borough(s).
- Hunger Solutions New York provides additional remote application assistance services.





NOEP Coordinators

- Conduct SNAP **outreach**, including presentations and community events.
- **Pre-screen** for eligibility and provide estimated SNAP benefit amount.
- Help gather documents, fill out, and submit a **SNAP application**.

All services are free and confidential.

- Offer **translation services**, home visits, and in-person or remote assistance.
- Work with local DSS/HRA to ensure applications are processed correctly and **resolve barriers**.
- Assist with recertifications.
- Provide referrals to other programs.

NOEP Outreach

NOEP conducts annual statewide outreach campaigns with specific audiences, including:

- Low-income college students
- Older adults
- Working families
- Families with children

Many NOEP Coordinators also conduct special outreach initiatives focused on:

- Veterans
- LGBTQ+
- Using SNAP benefits at farmers' markets



You shouldn't have to choose between food and medication.

If you're struggling to make ends meet, SNAP may be able to help. You can use SNAP benefits to buy groceries at local stores. Special rules make it easier for more seniors to apply for SNAP.

Get Help

NOEP Referrals

In addition to helping families connect with SNAP, NOEP Coordinators provide referrals to other resources. Top referrals in 2022-2023 included:

- Other food resources (e.g., summer meals, food pantries, congregate meals, WIC, etc.)
- Health care (e.g., Medicaid)
- Services for older adults
- Utility assistance
- Housing assistance
- Youth programs
- Employment programs








SNAP Help Long Island

lf you need help buying food, SNAP can help.



The COVID-19 pandemic continues to impact families. Find out if your family is eligible for SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program). SNAP provides monthly benefits to help you buy food. If you are eligible for SNAP, you can continue to receive meals from your school.

You can get and use SNAP while social distancing:

- Everything you need to do to apply for and receive SNAP benefits can be done by phone or online—no need to visit a local social service office.
- Use SNAP benefits at local grocery stores or shop online at Amazon, Walmart, or ShopRite and have groceries delivered or picked up. (See their websites for availability in your area.)
- Apply for SNAP online at MyBenefits.ny.gov

Need Help Applying?

The Nutrtion Outreach and Education Program (NOEP) helps families apply for SNAP, NOEP Coordinators help you see if you may be eligible for SNAP, answer questions, and help you complete and submit your application. Summer Meals

Through USDA's <u>Summer Food Service</u> <u>Program</u>, schools and community organizations can provide **free**, **healthy meals & snacks** for kids and teens during the summer break, when kids lose access to school meals.

At "open" summer meal sites, **any child or teen** 18 and under can drop by for a meal at **no cost**.





Summer Meals 2024

- Kids eat together on-site often enjoying fun activities, too!
- "Open" sites must be in eligible areas, where 50% or more of the community's children qualify for free or reduced-price school meals





Summer Meals: Rural Non-Congregate

As of 2023, a new permanent flexibility allows for "grab and go" or home delivered meals in **rural areas** when and where inperson meal service isn't available.

Summer EBT

- New federal program launching in summer 2024, administered by NYSOTDA.
- NY families will receive **\$120 per eligible** child on an EBT food benefit card.
- More <u>details</u> to come as NY stands up the program.
- SNAP outreach is a sure way to support access – eligible children receiving SNAP will automatically receive Summer EBT – no application necessary.





School Meals

Hunger Solutions New York provides no-cost one-on-one assistance to help schools:

- Apply for the Community Eligibility Provision, if eligible, to offer free meals to all students
- Start or expand Breakfast After the Bell
 programs
- Conduct outreach for SNAP

CACFP

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) funds healthy meals and snacks served to kids in eligible **child care centers, home-based day care**, and **afterschool** programs.

10,000+ providers and programs use CACFP in NY. Still, less than **50% of NY child care providers** currently participate.
