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**The online registration system used by The Long Island Pre-K Initiative was designed for public school staff registering for professional development. (It was formerly called My Learning Plan.) It can be confusing for educators from community-based organizations and private schools, or for those who are not educators.**

To make it easier for you, here are some tips for registering for one of the Long Island Kindergarten Summits:

- 1. You will be asked to create an account if you don't already have one.**
- 2. Ignore the information about using a credit card or purchase order.** The Kindergarten Summits are free. You will not be asked for payment
- 3. Do NOT select a school district when asked, unless you are an employee of a school district.**  
If you select the name of a school district, your registration will be sent to that school district for approval. If you do not receive a paycheck from that school district, your registration may be lost. Select "Other-Nassau" or "Other-Suffolk" if you are a parent or a community member; employed by a community-based organization or a private or parochial school; or work for a college.
- 4. If you are part of a group, each individual must be registered separately and an account must be created for each individual.**
- 5. If you do not receive a course confirmation, please log in again and review your registration information to make sure it is correct.**
- 6. After registering, if you find you are unable to attend, please log in and cancel your registration by October 1.** Once you do this, we can make your seat available to someone else.
